Notes From The Journey . . .



As I sit down to write these words the presidential election is less than 24 hours past and the results determined only hours ago. Even as you read these words the dust will still be settling. As with all such contests, there were winners and losers. For some this is a time to celebrate. For some this is a time to mourn. For many, whether their candidate won or lost, this is a time of conflicting and conflicted feelings. We are a country divided.

Nearly 50 percent of the voters preferred a different outcome. Strong words were spoken and deep resentments harbored on both sides. The election may be over, but our brokenness will not be healed so quickly or easily.

How, then, shall we who seek to be people of faith and good will respond? What word of hope shall we cling to in the midst of this difficult time? What message of healing shall we begin to embody in the days ahead? I confess there are times when I am tempted to despair. The brokenness seems to run too deep, the battle lines drawn too sharply. But then I recognize that such a temptation does not serve me well,

and certainly does not arise out of a faith perspective. One of the central qualities of faith, regardless of the specific shape and dimensions of that faith, is the conviction that we are not alone, that we are a part of something larger than ourselves, that there is more to this life than we can see. And thus encouraged by such hopeful faith, other possibilities begin to emerge besides despair. We need not stay as we are in this moment. Healing is possible.

We might begin by seeking a shift of perspective. There is such a strong tendency in these divisive days to view the world almost exclusively in terms of "us" and "them." "We" won and "they" lost (or visa versa). "We" are right and "they" are wrong. God is with "us" and God is against "them." "We" are important and "they" are the enemy. I do not believe that such thinking represents faith at its best. As people of faith, because we understand that we are a part of something larger than ourselves, we can strive to live into the reality that there is no "us" and "them." There is only "us." The ties which bind us together are strong, as citizens of

this country, as members of the human race, as residents of this planet, as children of the one God (by whatever name or names we use). Only when we begin to recognize the power of the connections we all share will we be truly able to meet the challenges which face us in these dark days. Such unity does not mean giving in or giving up just to get along. Serious engagement over serious issues will be required. But it is vital that we seek to work with others as partners, rather than against them as enemies. It is vital that we seek to seek understanding of those who hold different views, rather than simply dismiss them and condemn them.

Such a path will be difficult to find and even more difficult to follow. There is much in our current cultural “wisdom” that will argue against such “foolishness.” But if healing is to come to our nation and our world, I believe that those who can see beyond “us” and “them” must lead the way. May we begin anew with each moment and each person we meet. And remember, we are not alone in this effort. - Roger
