Introduction to Compassionate Communication February 8, 7-8 pm And Compassionate Communication Class February 15 to mid-May, 7-9 pm

A 13-week Compassionate Communication Class will be held Tuesday nights, 7-9 pm, in the Yellow House basement (next to the Unitarian Universalist Church of the Palouse at the corner of Second and Van Buren in Moscow) starting February 15. The class is based on Marshall Rosenberg's book: *Nonviolent Communication, a Language of Life*, and uses the exercises in the *NVC Companion Workbook* by Lucy Leu. Reading the first chapter before the class is recommended.

The basic model of Compassionate Communication is simple, but life changing. The practice, particularly helped by studying with a group, illuminates our habitual, often unhelpful, patterns of thinking and communicating so that we are able to consciously choose ways of interacting that connect us deeply and compassionately with ourselves and each other. We learn to observe without evaluating, identify, express and take responsibility for our feelings and needs, and make clear requests. We learn that the power of empathy is what makes violence not only unnecessary, but a poor strategy for getting our needs met. "...every relationship in your life — with family or friends, co-workers, students, teachers, even with yourself — has the potential for positive, permanent transformation" (L.Leu). Compassionate Communication is not about being nice; it is about directly and fully engaging in life.

If you are interested, please attend the Introduction on February 8 from 7-8 pm, on the main floor of the Yellow House. We will meet in the basement for the Class. 


Personal Glimpses. . .


