If you would like to represent us, please check with Roger Lynn ASAP.




Chocolate & Dessert Frenzy – Feb. 11th – 7 p.m.

Roof Fund

Late last year we replaced the roof over the sanctuary. The total bill was just over \$23,000 (it's a big roof). To pay for all of this we borrowed money from our own Edna Durbin Fund, which is intended to support educational programs at the church. It needs to be repaid. We have had one \$500 donation from an anonymous donor, along with several other smaller gifts. Without donations specifically earmarked for this purpose, repayment will come out of the general fund, thus reducing our ability to do ministry. If you would like to contribute to the repayment of this loan, you can do so by writing "roof fund" in the note on your check.
