

Notes From The Journey . . .



In my sermon on Sunday, November 12th, I did something that I don't often do (at least not in quite so dramatic and definitive a manner). I announced that I am taking a stand regarding what I have come to believe is an important issue of justice, equality and fairness for our day. In light of the current legal realities in this state (and most other states) concerning marriage, I have decided that I will no longer be complicit in the injustice of our current system. I will no longer lend my name to state-sanctioned discrimination. I will no longer sign state-issued marriage licenses, until such time as all people have equal access to the rights, privileges and protections currently associated with marriage. I will continue to officiate at religious marriage ceremonies, but anyone who wants their relationship to be legally recognized will need to take care of that at the court house.

This has been a very prayerful decision and not one which I have come to lightly. As many of you are already aware from other comments I have made over the years, this is an issue about which I have strong convictions. I finally reached the point

where I simply could not do nothing any longer. And I also recognize that not everyone shares my views. There will be some people who will not understand why I am doing this. Some may even disagree with my position. Please know that I do not have any desire for this to become a point of division. I remain open to dialogue with anyone who wants to share a conversation around this important issue. You can read my whole

I also recognize that this is not the only issue about which attention needs to be given. There may be important subjects which you would like to see addressed. There may be important projects which you would like to see undertaken. There may be important stands which you would like to make. The church ought to be a place where such discussions can occur, in an atmosphere of mutual respect based on the common bond of God's love which we share. So bring up your issues. Let's see what happens when we seek to be a community of faith together. - Roger


Interfaith Community Thanksgiving Vigil Tuesday, November 21st @ 5:30 p.m.


Replace the Copier Fund
