5th Annual Meeting – October 12th & 13th**




Please welcome them to our church family.




Faith Exploration Class - Sundays at 9:30 a.m.

Elders & Deacons

There is a group within the life of our congregation who have been charged with responsibility for the spiritual care of the church. The Board of Elders and Deacons is made up of nine people who are elected to three-year terms. Their most visible role is when they offer the invitation and prayer at the communion table. Perhaps their most important role is the shepherding lists for which they are responsible. The Elder/Deacons are divided into teams of two and each team has a portion of the congregation on their list. Each team handles their list differently, but you might get an occasional card or phone call from your Elder/Deacon, just checking in to see how things are going. And if there is ever something happening in your life where some extra support would be helpful, please don't hesitate to contact your Elder/Deacon.
